

From the Pastor

A Women's Lectionary for the Whole Church by Dr. Wilda C. Gafney

Beginning in Advent this year we will be using as our Sunday scripture selection guide *A Women's Lectionary for the Whole Church* by Dr. Wilda Gafney. Dr. Gafney has compiled and written this lectionary to center scriptures focusing on women in our understanding of the stories of God. As she writes in the preface to the Lectionary:

"What would it look like if women built a lectionary focusing on women's stories? What does it look like to tell the good news through the stories of women who are often on the margins of scripture and often set up to represent bad news? How would a lectionary centering women's stories, chosen with womanist and feminist commitments in mind, frame the presentation of the scriptures for proclamation and teaching?



The scriptures are androcentric, meaning, male-focused, as is the lectionary that is dependent upon them. As a result, many congregants know only the biblical men's stories told in the Sunday lectionary read in their churches. A more expansive, more inclusive lectionary will remedy that by introducing readers and hearers of scripture to "women's stories" in the scriptures.

These "women's stories" are not for women only. When engaged with curiosity and faithfulness, they can expand our understanding of how the Divine moves in the world and through whom. This is a gift of scholarship and hope that Dr. Gafney has offered the church.

Director of Music

Advent is here, a period of hope, anticipation and joy that culminates in Christmas. Oops, did I just overstate the obvious? Well, maybe not – there are plenty of folks out there who think Christmas starts the day after Thanksgiving. Or maybe the day after Halloween. But it's interesting, isn't it? I think of Christmas as a day that begins on the night before, or the "eve," as we call it, and the period of waiting that fills up most of December is just that – the coming, or the Advent. But don't we all have something in common? The folks who sing or listen to Christmas carols on December 5 are practicing their own style of waiting for something good. The shoppers who have all of their presents bought by the end of August are also full of anticipation. The Christmas cookies, the cards, the parties – they're all there to build up the excitement for the big day. No matter who you are, nobody can ignore the fact that the day exists because we celebrate the birth of a baby who will change the world, and give us hope in spite of our fears.

This first full week of Advent I had my own little brush with fear. On Tuesday morning I woke up with a very mild sore throat. It went away by lunchtime and I forgot about it. On Wednesday morning it was back again, and by lunchtime I felt feverish. Fearing it might be more than a cold, I took myself off to the Covid testing site, and after being tested I drove back to my house and stayed there to quarantine and wait for the results. Well, I quarantined for 36 hours waiting for those results, which finally came back negative. Heavy sigh. It was just a cold.

But, for 36 hours I obsessed over what I would do if I actually had Covid. I wasn't worried about getting terribly sick since I've been vaccinated and boosted, but I didn't know how I would handle a period of quarantine for up to two weeks. Rev. Lindsey's installation service happens Sunday. I was hired to play the Amherst College vespers service. I was about to prepare some sort of Holiday concert...live? Zoom? Everything was so uncertain...and there were social events with friends and family – why, this could have ruined the season for me!

Well, here I am, a little congested and fatigued, but able to wander about in the world, wearing a mask, of course. There will be a holiday concert and a Christmas Eve service and I don't have to quarantine. I still have anxiety about being ready for Christmas, but I remember my first Christmas here at South Church, almost 15 years ago. I had practiced and rehearsed with the choir and a brass group and prepared a veritable concert of Christmas music. I was a nervous wreck, until the sermon was delivered by Rev. Peter Heinrichs. I couldn't tell you everything he said, I just remember one sentence, which I paraphrase here. "It doesn't matter if you're ready for Christmas or not," he proclaimed. "It comes anyway." At that moment I nearly cried with relief and joy.

It seems like every month I tell you that I don't know what will happen with music at South Church because the virus precludes the kind of singing we used to have here. Thanks to Deltas and Omicrons, this month is no different. I don't yet know if we can have a full choir after the New Year, or sing more hymns, or have a jazz band again. I just know that church will continue as it has for 2,000 years. At Christmas we still celebrate the birth of Christ, during Lent we journey with Christ, on Good Friday we suffer with Christ and on Easter we rejoice in Christ's resurrection. Those events will happen whether or not we have great singing and instrumental ensembles, or even if

we're not together at the church, but waving to each other on computer screens. We will be here for each other as we always have been, comforting, feeding, encouraging, praying – that's the joy of Christmas.

Okay, it also doesn't hurt to have a lot of music and singing, does it? That will come, too. I promise.

May your Advent be full of hope, peace, love and joy, and may Christmas bring you music and laughter.


